Terms of Reference

Development Bank of Southern Africa July 2023

1. INTRODUCTION

The Development Bank of Southern Africa ("the DBSA" or "the Bank") is a Development Finance Institution ("DFI") wholly owned by the Government of the Republic of South Africa ("the shareholder"), with a mandate to finance infrastructure projects across Africa. This is achieved primarily through providing debt financing to infrastructure projects in the markets within which the Bank operates.

DBSA primarily plays a key role in the preparation, funding and building phases of the infrastructure development value chain. The diagram below illustrates the various services as well as the key target markets per value chain segments.

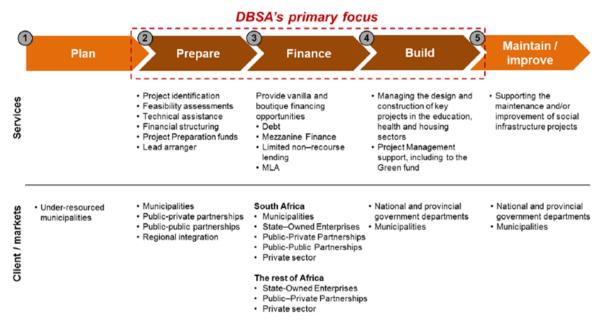


FIGURE 1: DBSA'S PRIMARY FOCUS AREAS

Regional integration is critical in growing both the South African and broader continent's economies. The DBSA's International Financing Division supports the Bank's regional development and integration strategy aimed at facilitating trade in Africa by investing in infrastructure projects outside of South Africa, through:

- Providing funding, related products and services for commercially viable and sustainable projects, primarily in the
 energy, transport, water and telecommunications sectors, which contribute to economic development and regional
 integration.
- Supporting project planning and development, advocacy and partnership building for resource mobilisation.
- Promotion of inter-regional integration and cooperation between SADC and the adjoining regional economic communities in Africa.

Full External Quality Assurance (EQA) Review of the Internal Audit Activity of the DBSA

1. Background

The Internal Audit function of the Development Bank of Southern Africa requires an External Quality Assurance (EQA) review of its Internal Audit Activity as required by its Charter as well as the International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing "Standards".

It is a requirement that an Internal Audit function is reviewed by an external independent assessor or team every five years. Quality Assurance review is mandatory in terms of IPPF as well as recommended practice by internal audit function.

Service providers are requested to submit detailed proposals in accordance with the scope and requirements set out hereunder.

2. Objective and Scope

The objective of the full EQA review is to evaluate the DBSA IA activity's conformance with the IIA's International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing "Standards". The review is expected to focus on identifying opportunities to enhance internal audit processes, offer suggestions to improve the effectiveness of the activity and promote ideas to enhance IA's image, credibility, and its ability to add value to the organisation.

The scope of the review will include the key elements of professional internal audit practice which will encompass planning, off-site work, onsite work, evaluation and issuing of final report with management comments.

In addition to the above, a review of the structure of the unit should be conducted.

3. Expected Deliverables, Outputs and Timelines

- The service provider must be able to conduct the EQA review in accordance with the timelines provided by the DBSA Chief Internal Auditor (CIA);
- Reviews will commence at the beginning of October 2023 and must be completed no later than the beginning of 30 November 2023. The final report must be issued no later than 15 December 2023.

- The service provider will be fully responsible and accountable for full management and quality control of the review and the team.
- The service provider will produce engagement and planning documents, complete and accurate work papers and quality draft and final reports.
- •This review will be conducted virtually and onsite where necessary, as the DBSA has implemented a hybrid Work-from-home policy, and for two days in a week work happens at our offices located at 1258 Lever Road, Midrand, Johannesburg.

4. Competency and Expertise Requirements of Resources

- It is required of the service provider to ensure that its team has the required knowledge, qualifications and experience to undertake the work;
- Only team members as assessed by the evaluations team in accordance with CV's submitted by the service provider will be entitled to conduct the review. If resources are replaced, internal audit must be provided with CVs of the replacement resources for assessment;
- The service provider must have internal audit and EQA expertise and knowledge in DFI/Banking sector, and public sector/SOE to conduct this review; this needs to be reflected in the team members' CVs:
- The team must have knowledge of the IPPF with its elements as well as King IV together with PFMA and Treasury Regulations;
- The service provider must have sufficient staff and time in order to complete the assignments within the prescribed time; and
- All elements of the review must be conducted in strict accordance with the International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Audit and with due diligence and professional care.

5. Project Reporting Arrangements

- The Team Leader / Manager from the service provider bring to the attention of the CIA all issues as they come up, throughout the review;
- All draft reports must be sent to the CIA for comments on the observations and recommendations; and
- A final report with action plans from the CIA will be sent to the CIA and copy to the Audit and Risk Committee chair as well as the Chief Risk Officer, who is the administrative reporting line for the CIA.

6. Minimum Proposal Requirements

Proposals must as a minimum contain the following information:

• Demonstration of the understanding of the requirements;

- Capacity, expertise and skills to undertake the assignments.
- References and details of clients where similar work has been conducted and CVs of the team members; and
- A total cost and disbursements provided in a separate folder to avoid disqualification.
