## **Expressions of Interest**

#### 1. Context

The Development Bank of Southern Africa (DBSA) was created to catalyze economic growth through investment in economic and social infrastructure and supporting regional integration. Its strategic objective is to drive sustainable growth and development impact, integrated infrastructure solutions and financial sustainability. The Bank aims to unlock infrastructure to the value of R1.5bn per annum by 2023/2024 as per the Corporate Plan. Against this background, the DBSA has a gender mainstreaming (GM) strategy, policy and processes that set the Bank on a path to adopt a gender lens approach that will lead to a gender transformed business environment. Gender Mainstreaming (GM) is an integral part of the Bank's Diversity, Equality, Inclusion and Belonging (DEIB) programme and is a guide to drive gender equality both internally and externally. It anchors DBSA's development position and statement commitment towards supporting the South African National Development Plan, where gender equality is addressed as an integrated theme throughout the plan; the African Union Agenda 2063 which sets clear continental targets for gender equality addressing gender mainstreaming; and the Sustainable Development Goals, particularly SDG 5, which focusses on Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment (GEWE).

Infrastructure projects have the potential to impact individuals and communities differently based on their demographics including gender. Women, youth and previously disadvantaged groups often face specific challenges and disadvantages in accessing and benefiting from infrastructure services. It is essential to address these gender disparities and promote gender equality and women's empowerment in all stages of infrastructure development. Through its gender mainstreaming framework, the DBSA is committed to foster gender mainstreaming in infrastructure, curtail gaps in the processes that currently cause opportunity blockages for women to ensure that future generations of women do not continue to face financial exclusion. The Bank's GM framework consists of four strategic pillars that are aligned for seamless creation of a gender sensitive environment both internally and externally. The Investment Pillar seeks to deploy capital, technical expertise and infrastructure delivery for achieving gender objectives and promoting investments in women-owned/led enterprises.

## 2. Purpose

The DBSA desires to establish its Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment (GEWE) service offering to address challenges faced by women and youth in infrastructure in four economic sectors namely: Energy, Water and sanitation, Transport and ICT as well as three social sectors: Education, Health and Social Housing of its focus. The Bank thus seeks to source and appoint a service provider to render technical consulting expertise to design and develop customized GEWE financing products for women's economic empowerment to effectively respond to the needs of women owned enterprises in infrastructure. The service provider will also develop suitable accompanying monitoring and evaluation (M&E) measures and indicators of success. The assignment will fulfil the objectives listed below:

- GEWE financing product/service offerings: Leverage the DBSA's financial instruments and design, conceptualize and develop innovative solutions to drastically transform the banking and financial landscape in Africa for women and youth.
- DBSA's women & youth technical assistance programmes are in place to provide advisory services and strengthen the capacity of women and youth entrepreneurs through training and capacity building initiatives to enhance business productivity and growth.

- DBSA's enabling environment programmes in place to break down all structural barriers impeding women and youth in business.
- To align gender disaggregated data collection, reporting and monitoring tools and methodologies that include realistic short- and long-term gender-responsive indicators of success with existing environment and social safeguards for case management.
- To develop a gender lens financing handbook to ensure that the institutional structure set-up will encourage the frontline team members to mainstream and address gender in their projects.

## 3. The scope of the programme

The Bank's GM initiative resulted in a shift and transition into a development impact and social change focus and a realisation that women owned or led businesses operate as small projects at lower quantum compared to their male counterparts. As such we adopted a project management approach to financing where the Bank's cross-functional teams have been working on redefining our lending and technical assistance processes to include smaller projects. The developed GEWE financing products are expected to align with and complement existing environment and social safeguard standards, (Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) mechanisms, related due diligence processes, project preparation initiatives and relevant investment policies. It will culminate in a customized GEWE service offering to promote gender equality in infrastructure also taking into account the Just Transition Integrated Framework.

## 4. Methodology

To ensure that gender responsive products are developed for the Bank's existing and potential clients, the examination of the extent to which current programmes/project processes and data collection mechanisms are gender responsive will be assessed to examine factors that hinder or promote GEWE. This will include the analysis of social and political project structures, tools and data collection methodologies that influence and/or are conducive to GEWE. This process is earmarked to strengthen/improve/enhance the effectiveness of gender results measurement and Monitoring & Evaluation mechanisms to transition from meeting quantitative requirements to impactful socio-economic change.

The assignment proposes mixed-methods approach using qualitative, quantitative and analysis for data collection. This can include desk-top reviews and contextual analysis (evaluation of external factors that influence project designs and planning), in-depth analysis of project/deals data, sample vulnerability assessments based on content analysis on existing failed and successful projects/deals and interviews with key role players based on stakeholder analysis.

The possibility of scaling and/or replicating the Green Climate Fund (GCF) and Global Environment Facility (GEF) gender action plans development processes will be assessed to address gender imbalances within DBSA funded deals/projects to pilot a gender smart investing in women owned/ed enterprises approach.

## 5. Expected outputs and Deliverables.

The appointed Service Provider, managed by the DBSA ESG Unit in collaboration with the DBSA's Gender Working Group, is expected to deliver Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment service offering and provide tools to support for the deployment of the gender mainstreaming strategy in the DBSA operations in alignment with the updated Environmental Social Management System. This Gender Mainstreaming project is meant to suit the DBSA's specific needs and scope as follows:

1. Design and develop three (3) DBSA's Gender lens financing products that will address financial and non-financial gender gaps in infrastructure and reduce barriers for women owned/led enterprises as below:

- a. GEWE financing product/service offering.
- b. DBSA's Women and youth technical assistance programmes
- c. DBSA's enabling environment programmes.
- 2. Recommend implementation modalities with clearly defined measures/indicators of success, M&E tools, templates and guidelines for effective execution of the proposed financing product/s. Recommendations to take into account the Bank's existing Environmental and Social Safeguard Standards, the Just Transition Framework and development impact measures and tools. Provide technical tools for Gender Mainstreaming as follows:
  - a. Design tools for disaggregated data collection, reporting and monitoring and methodologies that include realistic short- and long-term gender-responsive indicators of success.
- 3. Develop the DBSA Gender Mainstreaming Handbook. The handbook must have:
  - a. Introduction chapter providing background context for the DBSA, Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), DBSA's Gender Mainstreaming Strategy and position etc.
  - b. Various chapters per country where the DBSA has investments and each of the chapters per country must cover:
    - A list of critical or relevant gender legislative requirements and protocols per country
    - ii. Contact details and addresses of the Gender focal points for country.
    - iii. Contact details and addresses of various NGOs /interests groups on gender equality
  - c. A chapter on SADC Protocols on Gender, Green Climate Fund (GCF) requirements, and Global Environmental Facility (GEF)'s gender requirements.

## 5. Out of Scope

- The scope is limited to product and service development and enhancements in order to enable further alignment with the DBSA business' current operating model, culture, strategy, DBSA, Values and Behaviours.
- The duration of the programme should be informed by the content but not exceed six months (6 months).

## 2. Required expertise or products.

### The Service Provider for Gender Mainstreaming is expected to have/do the following:

- The institution/service provider should have over 10 years of practical experience in developing financial products for gender mainstreaming.
- The institution/service provider should have over 10 years of practical experience in designing and developing, tools on Gender Mainstreaming
- The institution/service provider should have over 10 years of practical experience in conducting Gender assessments and Gender Action Plans
- It will be advantageous to work with an institution that has a **niche** in **Gender Mainstreaming** or other similar products.
- Technical experts should have 10 years of providing gender technical support skills, developing gender mainstreaming financial products and demonstrable experience in conducting gender assessments and gender action plans (Preferably infrastructure projects).
- Written references (on a letterhead) from a minimum of five (5) leading organizations. At least one (1) of the references from financial services or related sectors will be an advantage.

## 3. Beneficiaries of the Project

DBSA Gender team, ESG team and frontline teams for the DBSA.

## 4. Time frames, Duration

Upon successful appointment, the Service Provider shall be expected to immediately commence work. It is assumed that tasks associated with this programme will require the Service Provider/s to be available for a period of the programme.

## 5. Management and Reporting

The Service Provider shall report to DBSA's Head: ESG and Gender Team in collaboration with other internal partners.

## 7. Technical Evaluation of Proposal

The Functional Criteria that will be used to test the capability of Bidders is provided in the below. The technical score will be calculated out of 100 points, and only the top six (6) bidders that achieve a threshold of 75 points will proceed to the next stage. Note that, not all bidders that score a minimum point of 75 will automatically be part of the shortlisted bidders. Only those that are ranked in top six (6) will be part of the shortlisting. Bidders that score the same score will be allocated the same rank to ensure fairness in the process of the ranking process.

### 8. Reservations

The DBSA expressly reserves the following rights:

- To appoint more than one service provider
- To waive any or all irregularities in the proposals submitted
- To appoint different service providers for different levels of work
- To retain the right not to select any Service Provider.
